SIGNS OF PROGRESS



Debris removal crews continue to make good progress in their efforts, with 353 properties cleared of debris so far. Eighty-four of those properties have further received final inspection reports, which follows successful soil testing results and the installation of erosion control measures (as shown in the AFTER photo). This is 57 more properties than were completed last week!

As debris removal crews continue to work efficiently to remove debris from remaining properties, the number of properties ready for rebuilding will significantly increase. Property owners who opted-in to the Government-Sponsored Program have reached out to express their gratitude for the professionalism, courtesy and sensitivity debris removal crews have shown during the debris removal process. One property owner called the Debris Removal Hotline to express her gratitude, saying "They were the best, they really were the best, thank you."
